4) Here are the meanings of the other examples of **get**.

A: Oh no! Did you **get** (receive) the homework?

B: Yeah. Have you started it yet? How far **have you got** (reach)?

A: Not far. I just **got started** (begin) when Nikki rang and told me about the party next week.

B: It sounds great – do you know who’s going?

A: I think Josh and Olivia are – did you know they’ve **got together** (be in a relationship) again?

B: Again? I **don’t get** (understand) **it**! And what about you and Charlie?

A: **Get** (be) **real**! No way that’s gonna happen!

B: Yeah, right.

A: Well, anyway – what’re you gonna wear?

B: No idea! I need to go and **get** (buy) a new top, I think.

A: Really? How many tops **have you got** (have)? Can I borrow that green one you wore at my party?

B: Yeah, sure. Come round and **get** (collect) it tomorrow.

A: Great, thanks. How are you planning to **get** (go) there?

B: What are the chances of **getting** (persuade) your mum to take us?

A: Mm...I’ll work on her. Better **get back to** (return to) this homework.
